### 1. CHRIST IS OUR \_\_\_\_\_

<sup>13</sup> so that it has become known throughout the whole imperial guard, and to everyone else, that my imprisonment is because I am in Christ. Philippians 1:13

<sup>20</sup> My eager expectation and hope is that I will not be ashamed about anything, but that now as always, with all courage, Christ will be highly honored in my body, whether by life or by death. <sup>21</sup> For me, to live is Christ and to die is gain. Philippians 1:20–21

<sup>27</sup> Just one thing: As citizens of heaven, live your life worthy of the gospel of Christ. Then, whether I come and see you or am absent, I will hear about you that you are standing firm in one spirit, in one accord, contending together for the faith of the gospel, <sup>28</sup> not being frightened in any way by your opponents. This is a sign of destruction for them, but of your salvation—and this is from God. Philippians 1:27–28

### 2. CHRIST OUR \_\_\_\_\_

If, then, there is any encouragement in Christ, if any consolation of love, if any fellowship with the Spirit, if any affection and mercy, <sup>2</sup> make my joy complete by thinking the same way, having the same love, united in spirit, intent on one purpose. <sup>3</sup> Do nothing out of selfish ambition or conceit, but in humility consider others as more important than yourselves. <sup>4</sup> Everyone should look not to his own interests, but rather to the interests of others. <sup>5</sup> Adopt the same attitude as that of Christ Jesus, <sup>6</sup> who, existing in the form of God, did not consider equality with God as something to be exploited. Philippians 2:1–6

<sup>13</sup> For it is God who is working in you both to will and to work according to his good purpose. Philippians 2:13

<sup>20</sup> For I have no one else like-minded who will genuinely care about your interests; <sup>21</sup> all seek their own interests, not those of Jesus Christ. <sup>22</sup> But you know his proven character, because he has served with me in the gospel ministry like a son with a father. Philippians 2:20–22

<sup>29</sup> Therefore, welcome him in the Lord with great joy and hold people like him in honor, <sup>30</sup> because he came close to death for the work of Christ, risking his life to make up what was lacking in your ministry to me. Philippians 2:29–30

<sup>3</sup> For we are the circumcision, the ones who worship by the Spirit of God, boast in Christ Jesus, and do not put confidence in the flesh— Philippians 3:3

<sup>7</sup> But everything that was a gain to me, I have considered to be a loss because of Christ. <sup>8</sup> More than that, I also consider everything to be a loss in view of the surpassing value of knowing Christ Jesus my Lord. Because of him I have suffered the loss of all things and consider them as dung, so that I may gain Christ <sup>9</sup> and be found in him, not having a righteousness of my own from the law, but one that is through faith in Christ—the righteousness from God based on faith. Philippians 3:7–9

<sup>10</sup> My goal is to know him and the power of his resurrection and the fellowship of his sufferings, being conformed to his death, <sup>11</sup> assuming that I will somehow reach the resurrection from among the dead. Philippians 3:10–11

<sup>19</sup> Their end is destruction; their god is their stomach; their glory is in their shame; and they are focused on earthly things, <sup>20</sup> Our citizenship is in heaven, and we eagerly wait for a Savior from there, the Lord Jesus Christ. Philippians 3:19–20

### 4. CHRIST OUR \_\_\_\_\_

<sup>6</sup> Don't worry about anything, but in everything, through prayer and petition with thanksgiving, present your requests to God. <sup>7</sup> And the peace of God, which surpasses all understanding, will guard your hearts and minds in Christ Jesus. <sup>8</sup> Finally brothers and sisters, whatever is true, whatever is honorable, whatever is just, whatever is pure, whatever is lovely, whatever is commendable—if there is any moral excellence and if there is anything praiseworthy—dwell on these things. <sup>9</sup> Do what you have learned and received and heard from me, and seen in me, and the God of peace will be with you. Philippians 4:6–9

<sup>12</sup> I know how to make do with little, and I know how to make do with a lot. In any and all circumstances I have learned the secret of being content—whether well fed or hungry, whether in abundance or in need. <sup>13</sup> I am able to do all things through him who strengthens me. Philippians 4:12–13

<sup>19</sup> And my God will supply all your needs according to his riches in glory in Christ Jesus. <sup>20</sup> Now to our God and Father be glory forever and ever. Amen. Philippians 4:19–20

<sup>9</sup> If you confess with your mouth, “Jesus is Lord,” and believe in your heart that God raised him from the dead, you will be saved. <sup>10</sup> One believes with the heart, resulting in righteousness, and one confesses with the mouth, resulting in salvation. Romans 10:9–10
