"(Idolatry is) When human beings give their heartfelt allegiance and worship to that which is not God" -NT Wright, *Surprised by Hope*

3. What is Idolatry according to the Bible?

I am the Lord your God who rescued you from the land of Egypt, the place of your slavery. You must not have any other god but me. (Exodus 20:2-3, NLT)

So put to death the sinful, earthly things lurking within you. Have nothing to do with sexual immorality, impurity, lust, and evil desires. Don't be greedyanger, rage, malicious behavior, slander, and dirty language.......... Put on your new nature, and be renewed as you learn to know your Creator and become like him." (Colossians 3:5-10, NLT)

 - Seeking purpose, identity
 - It's easy, predictable, and controllable.
 - It's convenient
 - It's indulgent
 - It puts us at the center
- 10. Why are we drawn to idolatry?
 - We fulfill our needs in ways God didn't design
 - Sexual immorality --> Intimacy
 - Lust --> Stress relief
 - Greed --> Contentment
 - Slander --> Conflict resolved within community
 - Filthy language --> Blowing off steam or to be understood among peers
 - Lying --> Trust

 - Pursuing career and other personal pursuits that lead to personal glory, neglecting family
 - Finding identity in our belongings
 - Hobbies like technology or fashion that create financial strain
 - Substance abuse (even when it's legal)
 - Gambling
 - Politics

- 13. What is the cure for idolatry? Become as children.
- 14. Jesus talked about the Kingdom of God more than any other topic
 One day some parents brought their children to Jesus so he
 could touch and bless them. But the disciples scolded the
 parents for bothering him. When Jesus saw what was
 happening, he was angry with his disciples. He said to
 them, "Let the children come to me. Don't stop them! For the

Kingdom of God belongs to those who are like these children. I tell you the truth, anyone who doesn't receive the Kingdom of God like a child will never enter it. "Then he took the children in his arms and placed his hands on their heads and blessed them. (Mark 10:13–16, NLT)
